Drawing on field experience from Gaza and other humanitarian settings, it focuses on creating safety, stabilization, and coping within constrained environments while maintaining ethical and professional boundaries. Participants will examine real-world applications through a blend of reflection, discussion, and short experiential exercises that model safe and grounded engagement.</p>
